Separated Materials	Possible Re-use/ Recycling
asphalt	crushed & mixed with new asphalt, road sub-base
concrete (no rebar)	road sub-base; re-used in concrete; concrete blocks, fill material; rip-rap on roads/lagoons
concrete (rebar)	fill material; rip-rap
separated rebar; metal signs; sign posts; guardrails; culverts	re-use for original purpose; processing at a steel mill
fill materials (earth, gravel, sand)	clean fill material; landscaping material; landfill cover
topsoil	landscaping; residential fill; landfill cover; agricultural
sand	fill; residential; road construction
stones	rip-rap; fill; landscaping
earth contaminated with wood; buried utilities	landfill daily/intermediate cover; disposal at landfill
trees & brush	firewood; landfill disposal
soils	landscaping; agricultural and residential fill
mixed concrete, rubble	land reclamation fill; bank stabilization/rip-rap landfill disposal
clean bricks; whole cindercrete blocks; tiles; ceramics	re-use for original purpose; landscaping
undamaged windows; roofing and metal/vinyl siding; wooden cabinets, counters, flooring, staircases/trim; carpeting; clean insulation; wooden beams/facades	resale for re-use
broken bricks, cindercrete blocks; concrete/stone facades; tiles/ceramics	landscaping; rip-rap; fill at landfills; clean fill for land reclamation
broken window glass, glass fixtures	recycle at glass recycler
broken wooden beams; trim; wood scrap; trees; unpainted, unfinished, untreated wood	chipping or shredding for landscaping; fuel source
metal girders, supports, rebar, steel, damaged metal siding, roofing	recycle at a steel mill
scrap aluminum door & window frames	sell to scrap dealer

New Demolition Waste Requirements:

Given new Provincial regulations related to the operations of municipal landfills, and the subsequent extreme costs of developing new landfills, the Town of Maple Creek must extend the life of our existing landfill for as long as possible.

Therefore mixed materials from building demolitions will no longer be accepted at the Maple Creek Landfill.

Before demolition waste is brought to the Maple Creek Landfill, it must be separated into different waste streams so that the majority of the demolition material can be recycled or reused.

Please consult the chart on the back of this brochure for categories into which all demolition materials must be sorted.

Dismantling VS Demolition:

To meet these new landfill requirements the Town of Maple Creek recommends that any building be systematically dismantled rather than demolished.

Take down the building methodically so that its component elements are easily separated into the required waste streams for possible recycling and reuse.

Alternatives to Dismantling:

Since this approach will inevitably increase the time and possibly the costs of removing a building, the Town of Maple Creek suggests the following alternatives to dismantling a building:

- ◆ Explore the possibility of moving the building for re-use elsewhere.
- ◆ Rehabilitate and/or repurpose the building to better meet your needs. In the case of commercial buildings within the Maple Creek Heritage District, heritage conservation incentives may help with a portion of the costs.

The “greenest” buildings are the ones that already exist. Almost every building can be upgraded to improve structure, functionality and energy efficiency.

New Construction Waste Requirements:

Waste materials generated by the construction of a new building must be dealt with in the same way as demolition waste.

All construction waste must be separated into different waste streams so that the majority of the construction waste material can be recycled or reused.

Mixed construction waste will not be accepted at the Maple Creek Landfill.

Unauthorized Disposal:

Construction or demolition waste that has been unlawfully disposed of at a non-permitted facility is a contravention of the **Municipal Refuse Management Regulations**, and is in contravention of the **Environmental Management & Protection Act 2010**, regardless of whether it is disposed of on private or public property.

The burning of non-separated construction and/or demolition waste is prohibited and is also in contravention of the **Environmental Management & Protection Act 2010**.

Construction and/or demolition material abandoned on land owned by another person, land held by Her Majesty the Queen in right of Saskatchewan, land reserved for public use, or in any body of water is considered littering.

Construction & Demolition Waste Definition:

Construction and demolition (C&D) waste includes all materials associated with buildings, including the following materials:

Wood	Electrical &
Drywall	Plumbing materials
Brick	Siding
Soffit	Fascia
Earth	Carpeting
Flooring	Windows
Metals	Roofing materials
Insulation	Concrete
Culverts	Pipes

Ask yourself a few questions before heading to the Landfill:

- ◆ Is the item reusable?
- ◆ Would someone else be interested in using this item?
- ◆ Can I sell it?
- ◆ Can I recycle it?
- ◆ Can I repurpose it?
- ◆ Have I sorted my load?
- ◆ Is my load covered?

What can I expect when I arrive at the Landfill?

- ◆ Landfill attendant will inspect your load
- ◆ Landfill attendant will accept tokens according to the size and type of load you are disposing of (reference the tipping fees chart)
- ◆ Landfill attendant will give you directions as to where you should dispose of your load
- ◆ Proceed according to the directions given

The Town of Maple Creek thanks you for your cooperation in following the directions from the Landfill attendant.
