





HISTORY OF MAPLE CREEK

Established in 1883 Incorporated in 1903

In the fall of 1882, construction of Canada's first transcontinental railway halted for the winter just east of the present day town site, where a number of crew workers set up a wintering camp. In the spring of 1883, buildings and businesses sprung up and Maple Creek was born.

In 1903, Maple Creek was incorporated as a town. In 1907, the Mayor and Councillors decided to proceed with a gravity-fed water system for the town. Water was piped into the community from springs located SE of Maple Creek. Most of Maple Creek's present water supply still comes from that main source.

During 1913, there was a large increase in population. It was reported that approximately 600 train cars of settlers' effects were unloaded at the Maple Creek Station. The town also had its own electric light system and a flourmill in the early years.

For hundreds of years, the Cypress Hills were used as a wintering ground for the Plains Indians. The hills were also important because they provided firewood, wild game, and lodgepole pine, which are excellent for tipi poles and travois for both dogs and horses. No native group ever monopolized the

Hills and so it was a winter home to many groups such as Cree, Assiniboine, Blackfoot, Gros Ventre, and others.

Fort Walsh played a large role in the development of Maple Creek. The Fort was built in 1875, with the Town of Fort Walsh soon following. During its day, the town was the largest centre between Winnipeg and Vancouver. However, when Fort Walsh was abandoned in 1883, the town's people abandoned the town as well. The NWMP moved to new barracks just outside of Maple Creek. The town's people flocked to the railhead in Maple Creek to continue their businesses.



Behind the Name

How did Maple Creek get it's name? There is a small creek (often dried up in recent years as it is dependent on the amount of moisture we receive each year), that runs along the north and west perimeter of town (along the PFRA road behind Cobble Creek Lodge and Lion's Park).

In 1903, when the town was incorporated, it was named 'Maple Creek' because of the abundance of Manitoba Maple trees that were growing along the banks of the small creek. If you go for a stroll along the banks, you may come across them still today.

Heritage District

In many ways, Maple Creek's past is building its future. Today, over 325,000 tourists visit annually — attracted by the natural beauty of the Cypress Hills and our authentic western heritage.

In 2009, the Maple Creek Heritage District was formally designated, making it one of only two formally recognized Heritage Districts in the province. In 2019, Maple Creek was awarded the 'Prince of Wales Prize' for outstanding municipal heritage leadership. Maple Creek is the first Saskatchewan recipient of this prize.





JASPER CULTURAL & HISTORICAL CENTRE

At 20,000 square feet of exhibit, programming and meeting space, the Jasper Cultural and Historical Centre in Maple Creek is one of the largest museums in southwest Saskatchewan. Set within a beautiful downtown greenspace, the museum is housed in a two-storey public school building that was built in stages between 1910-1914.

The Centre includes monthly programming, rotating exhibits, art galleries, gift shop, and multiple themed rooms including, the Parlour, Fleming Collection, Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) Room, Roger Newby Western Room,

Geraldine Moodie Women's Gallery, Bert Ingram Rodeo Room, Michel Oxarat Western Gallery, Post Office and Sports and School rooms.

In 1885, the citizens of Maple Creek area decided to look into the education of their children. In 1887, a log building was erected at the corner of Maple Street and First Avenue. This building was to be used as a community school. By the early 1890s, the log building was no longer capable of meeting the needs of the children as more rooms were needed.

In 1895, a stone school was built on the northwest corner of the lot where the

Jasper Centre is currently located. Once again, the needs of the students outgrew the four-room school and a new, four-room red brick school was constructed in 1910. Once the brick school was built, the stone school was torn down. In 1913, an addition was added on the west side of the school, increasing the number of classrooms to 12 in total. The Jasper Street School taught students from Grade One to Grade Twelve until 1950.

S.W. SASK OLDTIMERS' **MUSEUM & ARCHIVE**

Concerned that the memory of the frontier period and the history of Maple Creek and the Cypress Hills was starting to fade, the S.W. Sask Oldtimers' Museum & Archive was established in 1926 and commemorates the 1870-1918 period of the Cypress Hills area.

What is believed to be the oldest purposebuilt museum building in Saskatchewan was constructed in 1935 to house the museum's growing collection. As the collection continued to grow, a variety of additions were made. Unfortunately, by 2011, these additions were beginning to structurally fail. The decision was made to

construct a new Log building behind the original structure and the original museum was reconstructed and now serves as our gift shop.

Today, the S.W. Sask Oldtimers' Museum serves as the steward of three Municipal Heritage Properties within the Maple Creek Heritage District: the W.R. Orr Building at 114 Jasper Street (Visitor Centre), the Log Museum Complex at 218 Jasper Street (heritage exhibits), and the C.M. Glascock Building at 222 Jasper Street (now serving as a temporary exhibit hall for some of the larger collection items as well as art gallery and venue space).

The museum operates full-time during the tourist season (May long weekend to September long weekend), and has a yearround facilities manager who can arrange private tours for individuals or groups. If you are visiting Maple Creek, don't miss out on a tour of the Museum and the Historic Story it tells!







